BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS IN THE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

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DEFINITION

 BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS are viruses, bacteria and other micro-organisms that produce disease.

 They may be present in a person's blood and other body fluids.

POTENTIAL PATHOGENS

■ HEPATITIS B VIRUS (HBV)

HUMAN IMMUNODEFICIENCY VIRUS (HIV)

HBV and HIV can be acquired on the job by exposure to a person's blood or body fluids.

Blood Borne Pathogens Can Enter Your Body By:

- OPEN CUTS/NICKS
- RASH IF SKIN IS BROKEN
- MUCOUS MEMBRANE SPLASH
- NEEDLE PUNCTURE
- HUMAN BITE
- INFECTED NEEDLES/EQUIPMENT

■ INDIRECTLY BY TOUCHING A CONTAMINATED SURFACE AND TRANSFERING IT TO YOUR MOUTH, EYES, NOSE OR OPEN SKIN

UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS

TREAT ALL BLOOD AND BODY FLUIDS AS IF THEY WERE KNOWN TO BE INFECTED WITH A BLOODBORNE PATHOGEN.





HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF

WASH YOUR HANDS!



LATHER WITH SOAP AND RUB YOUR HANDS
VIGOROUSLY UNDER RUNNING WATER FOR AT
LEAST 15 SECONDS. RINSE AND DRY
COMPLETELY WITH A PAPER TOWEL AND TURN
THE WATER OFF USING THAT TOWEL.



WORK PRACTICES

- WASH YOUR HANDS!
- **USE NON-LATEX GLOVES**
- COVER ANY BROKEN SKIN
- WHEN DOING CPR USE PROTECTIVE BARRIER
- BE CAREFUL HANDLING SHARPS
- DISPOSE OF SHARPS IN BIOHAZARD CONTAINERS IN THE HEALTH OFFICE

- HAVE BODY FLUID SPILLS CLEANED UP AS SOON AS POSSIBLE
- DISPOSE OF INFECTIOUS WASTE IN BIOHAZARD CONTAINER IN HEALTH OFFICE OR IN MAINTENANCE AREA

1. ENGINEERING CONTROLS

2. UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS

EVERY PERSON'S BLOOD AND BODY
FLUID IS CONSIDERED TO BE

CONTAMINATED

3. PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQU' GLOVES

EXPOSURE CONTROL PRECAUTIONS

4. SAFE WORK PRACTICES

- WASH SKIN IMMEDIATELY AFTER ACCIDENTAL CONTACT
- DON'T EAT, DRINK, OR SMOKE IN WORK AREAS
- COVER CUTS, SCRAPES AND ABRASIONS

TASKS OR AREAS WITH POTENTIAL OCCUPATIONAL EXPOSURE

- PROVIDING STUDENT PERSONAL HYGEINE CARE
- CLEANING LAVATORIES
- ASSISTING SICK/INJURED CHILD
- INJURIES RELATED TO ACTIVITIES IN THE CLASSROOM:

- GYMNASIUM
- SPORT VENUES
- CUSTODIAL & MAINTENANCE AREAS

WHAT TO DO?

 WASH OR FLUSH AFFECTED BODY AREA WITH WATER

WASH WITH SOAP AND WATER

 REPORT TO SUPERVISOR
 IMMEDIATELY FOR POST-EXPOSURE FOLLOWUP
